Treasurer's Report

Hot lunch forecasted profit is \$10,000 less than previous years. Robin Churchill is currently investigating why this is.

Cake Walk was a huge success! We raised \$2600.30 thanks to our event coordinators/volunteers and our generous parents! Suggestion was made to make ticket prices at future events round numbers to make it less time consuming for those counting the money.

Forecasted profits for all events in our budget are very conservative, based on previous years profits.

MASC grant forecasted income has been changed from \$2000 to \$200 as we missed the deadline. The \$200 grant is still available. Jen Bell informed council that the deadline has been extended to November 30/15. Sonia Williams and Jen Bell are planning to submit for the \$2000 grant before this deadline.

There is a reimbursement request from Sonia Williams for the Archive Committee of \$22.58. This will cover her out of pocket cost for the DVD's required for Mr. Bryant's interview.

c) School Website Update

Kim Cable asked members of the council, especially event coordinators, to check the council website to ensure details listed are correct. Input and feedback is needed.

Suggestion was made for a KOTR School Council Facebook Group. Michelle Farncombe will start this group.

Discussion about whether to post budget on website. We are required to have it accessible to the public, and as such, it is in our council binder in

the office. There is concern that the budget may be taken out of context and that is why we have not posted it on the website in that past. Priority for the council is to be transparent and we decided as a whole that we should look to posting it in the future. Also, suggestions were made to add an explanatory note to the budget to encourage those who have questions to get in touch with the council. Further suggestions included making the budget more readable for the public, to provide other info to support the budget, and/or to provide budget only 3x/year. To gain further input on this, Michelle Crogie and Robin Churchill will attend the November OCASC meeting and ask what is appropriate. We will come back to this issue next meeting. For now, we will continue to put the budget in the council binder, but not post it on the website.

<u>d) Literacy & Education</u> <u>Programs</u>

Council had asked Sonia Williams to ask the teachers what they wanted this money to fund. The teachers came back with the following request, with a slightly higher ask (\$422.05) and with different grade participation. Council agreed that we should support the teachers in what they deem to be most appropriate for the educational programming money. Please see new spending request form below. Comment from Rick Haggar is to rotate events so that we do not repeat the same events year after year.

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e) Current School Dance Format

Kim Cable raised a point about the current school dance format. Currently the dances involve Grades 6-8 and include slow-dances. There are alternatives to the dance as well, including a movie, computer lab use and free work-time. The concern is that there may be undue anxiety generated by the dance portion, in that this age group may not be ready for this type of social anxiety. After much discussion, it was agreed that this social event is promoting healthy relationships in a place where kids can learn how to establish healthy limits before entering high school.

The dances are well chaperoned and well-lit. Rick is amenable to limiting the number of slow-dances and speaking to the students at an assembly to discuss expectations.

b) Hot Lunches / Loonie-Toonie Sale / Turkey Luncheon

Turkey Luncheon

Discussion of whether the Hot Turkey Luncheon should be a fundraiser this year or remain an event that's focus is on school/community building without looking to make a profit. Currently, the cost of the event is \$5.00 and this covers the cost, assuming an 80% participation rate. Past years have shown participation to be around 80%. There is an estimated profit of \$1200, which is a buffer in case estimates are incorrect (see estimate number below - provided by Megan Dodge)

General consensus was reached to keep cost of Turkey Luncheon to \$5.00.

Extra Notes about the Luncheon:

- Three seatings: first two seatings included Grades JK thru Grade 6. All kids, including those who do not purchase a Turkey Lunch, go to the Kars RA for the lunch. Kids will either eat their own lunch packed from home or the purchased Turkey Lunch.
- Discussion of providing a gluten free option for the cupcakes and rolls. Robin Churchill and Michelle Crogie expressed interest in providing these.
- Paula Panetta was unable to secure free turkeys.
